1. Where can I find schedules for the Regional Site Visits?

2. Can we choose which regional site visit to attend or is this chosen for us?

If you are based in a region where a site visit will be hosted, you will be expected to attend the session in your region (Latin America, MENA, Sub-Saharan Africa).

If you are not based in one of those regions, GBSN will work with you to determine what would be the best fit.

3. Who will be my mentor during the second session?

Each participant is assigned a mentor who will provide guidance and support throughout the duration of the program. GBSN will assign mentors prior to the start of the program.

4. What are the chances for Deans in Afghanistan to participate?

A Dean from any developing country can participate in the program. Although limited spaces are available, we aim to accommodate all eligible applicants.

5. Is the initial orientation from July 23 – 27 going to be held at Cornell only?

Yes, the first session will be held at Cornell only – at both their Ithaca, NY and New York City campuses.

6. Will we be able to attend the full GBSN Conference or just the day and a half closing session?

Admission into the program includes full conference registration, so participants can attend the entire conference.

7. Will you be able to assist participants with the visa process?

If required, GBSN will work with host institutions to provide visa letters in a timely manner.

8. How can we enhance the students' retention with our institution?

Each institution deals with student retention in different ways – from creating a community environment to relevance of curriculum and teaching pedagogy. We encourage you to apply to the program to learn more about this specific issue and ways in which you can address it at your particular institution.
