Problem

People in Mozambique lack access to food in both the short and long-term after disasters

Geography

Over 1500 miles of coastline making Mozambicans vulnerable to natural disasters such as cyclones

Livlihoods

About 70% of Mozambicans work in agriculture, a sector that is extremely vulnerable to disasters and climate change

Economic

Per Capita in 2020 was \$450USD. 41%-46% of Mozambicans live in poverty.

Infrastucture

Homes are considered easy to build, and are quickly rebuilt after disasters. The reason people struggle after disasters is food, not housing.

Our Research


Primary

We conducted virtual interviews with local experts. Through these interviews, we learned about community resiliency, disaster response, current solutions, and food insecurity.



Secondary

We also used secondary research by reading academic articles on the topic, as well as read articles put out by leading NGOs in the disaster response space.

Resiliency Kit Project Pilot

The project will be piloted next year after funding has been secured. The first part of the year will be securing funding, supplies, and partnerships. The community workshops will begin in September of 2022 in selective communities.

Resiliency Kit Project Expansion

During this year, we will expand our program to as many regions as possible. We are hoping to engage 15 to 19 million people during this phase. We are also expanding our supply chains and sourcing partners.

Resiliency Kit Project Stability

In 2024, we are enabling communities to lead their own workshops and trainings, and the government and NGOs step back and observe, ready to step in and support if needed.


